## A Little Easter

You may remember that I wrote a reflection in January's newsletter on how I experienced God's glory in some sad hospital visits on this past Christmas Day.

One of the visits was to see a six day old baby in the neonatal intensive care unit at UK Medical Center. I received a call from the chaplain there, explaining that the doctors expected the child to die when they received support from him late on Christmas afternoon. The Hispanic parents of the child asked to have the child baptized before he died. I called the parents and arranged to meet them at the child's bedside at 3:30.

During my conversation with them and during the baptism ceremony, I had the strong sense that my brother was present with us. My mother gave birth to this brother on Christmas Eve many years ago and that brother was baptized at the hospital immediately after his birth, and he died 15 minutes later. I connected with them and with the parents of this child I baptized. I stayed with them for a while, and then I spoke to the mother for the time later that day when she would have to hand the body of her baby boy to the hospital director. I then took my leave in order to travel to Northern Kentucky in order to be with my family for Christmas Night.

I thought I might hear from those parents about making arrangements for their child's burial. But I thought it was as likely that they may have had relatives in another town, and performed the rites there. But I had a peace in my heart that the child's death would end in glory.

A week ago, after the 1pm Sunday Mass at Mary Queen, a young couple approached me. They identified themselves as the couple from the hospital on Christmas Day. I asked them how they were dealing with their grief. They looked at me and smiled and showed me a picture of their son on their smartphone. The child was alive!

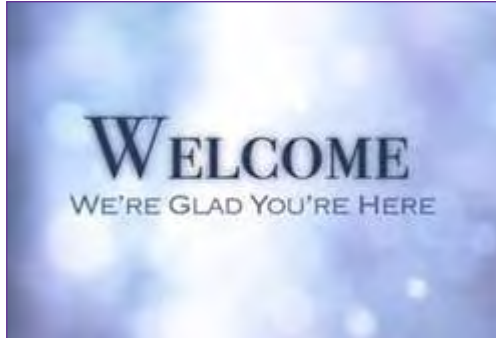
He started an absolutely improbable recovery late on Christmas afternoon, right after his baptism. The mother said it was a miracle. He is due to get out of the hospital soon. I can't wait to hold him in my arms. I have the sense that he is my new little brother, saved through the intercession of my brother who died at childbirth, and through the intercession of my Mom.

As you prepare to celebrate Easter, don't ever lose hope in the resurrection of the dead.

## March 2018 Financial News Notes:

- Mark your calendars...There will be the 5th annual spring fundraiser entitled "Night of Angels" on April 20th at The Round Barn Stable of Memories at Red Mile. There will be food and refreshments and live auctions and a raffle. Last year the event made over \$52,000 for our school operating budget is \$45,000. Please watch the bulletin, website, etc. for details.
- Mark your calendars...Festival 2018... The date will be October 12 -13. Any and all volunteers are welcome. We need you....contact Melissa Sloan.
- The 2018-2019 budgets are in process. Tuition rates have been approved.
- The Mary Queen Finance Council has implemented a Cash Liquidity Management policy effective 1/1/18. With this policy, we are to manage a cash liquidity of 45-60 days. Any liquid cash in excess of 60 days will be used for appropriate parish use as directed by the Pastor. Fr. Dan has issued the following P

### PROCEDURE FOR DETERMINING THE USE OF THE AVAILABLE MQHR \$400K

January, 2018

Father Dan will consult with the Parish Pastoral Council, the Committees represented on the Council, the Hispanic Leadership Group (Comite), and the Parish Staff before he decides on how best to use the \$400,000 available to further the Mission of Mary Queen of the Holy Rosary Parish.

The suggestions on how best to use the money must be drawn from the current Parish Goals and Objectives, and/or be mentioned in Mary Queen's response to the draft Diocesan Pastoral Plan, or the emerging plan to support in legal ways local immigrants and their families who are being threatened with deportation. Fr. Dan has already decided that some of the \$400K will be used to run the bus that the parish will purchase with other money already donated to purchase a bus. He has also decided that some of the \$400K will be used to purchase a new data system for the parish, and that some of the \$400K will be used to support those threatened with deportation. He wants advice on how much of the \$400K should be used for those purposes, as well as other suggestions.

Each parish committee represented on the Council, and also the Comite, will consider how best to allocate the money, considering the ministries that committee coordinates, as well as the bigger picture of parish needs. The staff will have ongoing discussions as well. The committees represented on the Parish Pastoral Council will give their input to the Council no later than its March 27, 2018 meeting, which will be a joint meeting with the Comite. Hopefully, consensus on a proposal to Fr. Dan as to how to spend the money will be reached at that meeting. Fr. Dan will take the consensus to the Parish Staff for final input before making his decision.

- The Fish Fries began on Friday February 16th and run each Friday through March 23rd. All volunteers are needed and welcome. I look forward to seeing you there. - There was a Stewardship Ministry Fair on March 3rd and 4th so Committee representatives could share their ministries. Thanks to all.

# Social Justice

MQ's Justice Ministry is strong and growing! We had our Network meeting on Monday, February 12 where we heard why doing justice is critical to living with faith, we got updates on the issues and heard powerful testimony on the difficulties (and the blessings) of loving someone with a drug addiction. The 68 people that came (double the number we had last year!) each choose at least 8 names of people they will invite to the BUILD Nehemiah Action so we can reach our goal of getting at least 350 people at the May 10 Nehemiah Action.

While we are working on growing our justice network the issue research is going forward.

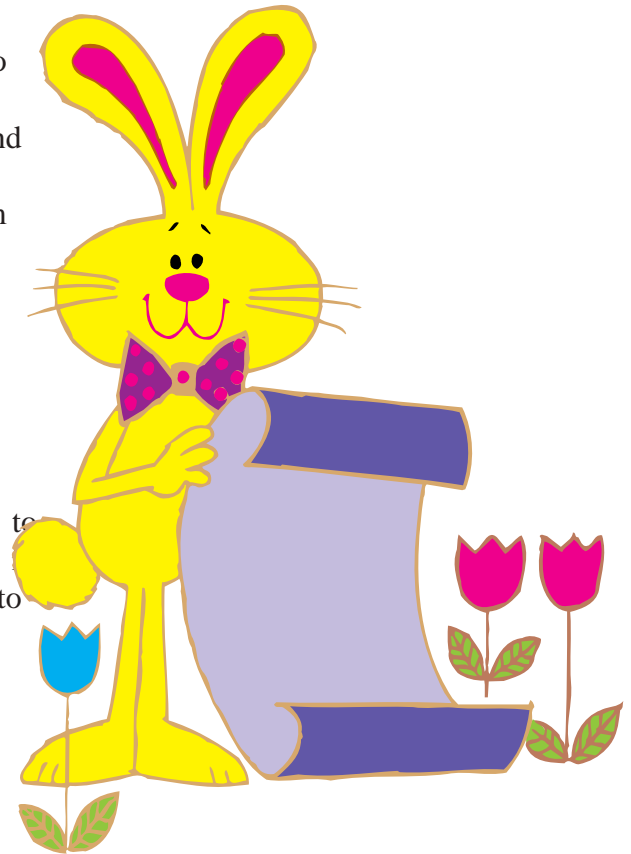
- The MENTAL HEALTH committee met with Bluegrass.org to get an update on the ACT team. We were disappointed that they did not come with, nor are they willing to share the data on the number of people being served or the current staffing of the ACT team. The committee will meet soon to talk about how to proceed. We have a meeting with Vice Mayor Steve Kay soon to talk about city funding for mental health court.

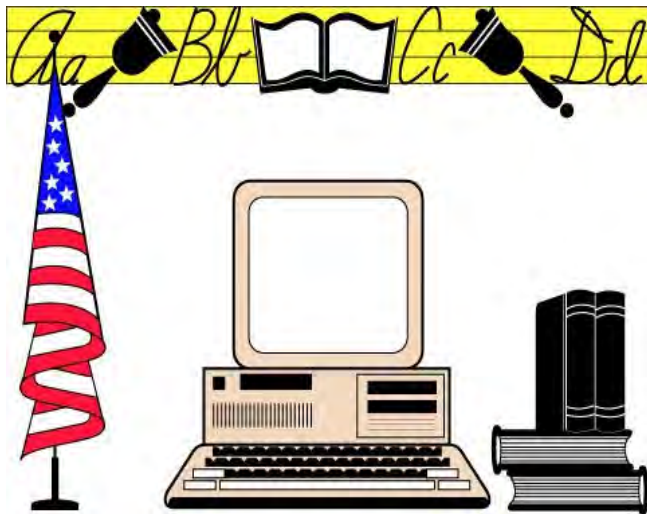
- The CRIME committee finally got a 30 minute meeting with the mayor. There was so much we wanted to know regarding the changes in the city staff (Chief of Police and Commissioner of Public Safety), what the mayor and staff learned and plans made from their attending the National Network for Safe Communities last Summer, talk about funding for mental health court, and our serious concerns about the drug problem and continuing gun violence. The most important goal of this meeting was getting his commitment to attend the Nehemiah Action May 10. He would not agree at this time to attend the Action but will give us an answer April. We all agreed we wanted to continue to dialogue about these issues and he would meet with us again in April.

- The DRUGS committee has had many meetings learning about the many facets of drug use and treatments in Lexington. They are meeting with the courts and police, experts on addiction and treatments, life

saving programs like needle exchange and Narcan. The steering committee is meeting soon to narrow down the focus and then looking to proven programs.

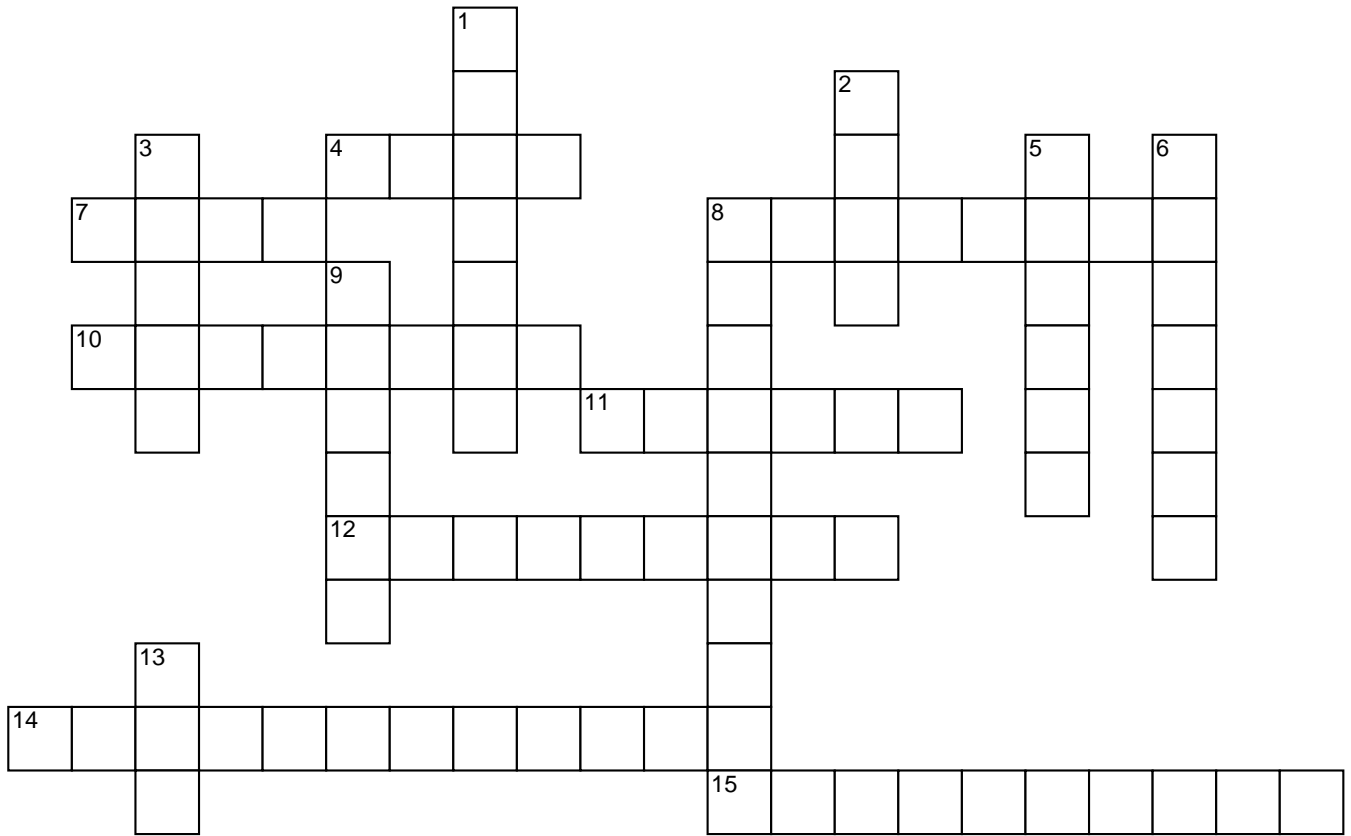
